Pete Earles Highway Project Updates

Program Category: Geometric Improvement (GI)

Program Fiscal Year: 2024

Project Location: Improve US-160 Stubbs Street Intersection (County Road K)-Extension of Existing US-160 Project.

Project Scope: Geometric improvements to widen roadway/shoulder, full-depth pavement replacement, and pavement marking. Additionally, include recommendations from Traffic Investigation Report of US-160 & Stubbs Rd Intersection. This includes re-installing the stop bar on NB & SB approaches, relocateding Stop Ahead sign on NB approach to 225 ft from radius, updating existing SB Stop Ahead sign, Converting bypass lanes to Right Turn Lanes, increasing size of stop signs on NB & SB approaches.

Project Length: 0.210

Local Share Percentage: 10% KDOT Share Percentage: 90%

Total Local Share \$103,560.00 Total Requested from KDOT: \$932,040.00

Project Name: Kepley Middle School Pedestrian Crossing Hwy 25

Location: 113 N Colorado

Proposed Scope of Work: Kepley Middle School is located along Hwy 25 (Colorado Street) in Ulysses. The school has locations on both sides of the Highway. They are connected via two existing crosswalks located between Kansas Avenue and Grant Avenue. This generates a great deal of pedestrian traffic crossing Hwy 25, as a result of students moving from building to building during the school day. The highway has a crossing distance of 55'.

The frequent use of pedestrian crossing as well as the highway volume of vehicular traffic using Hwy 25 creates a need for a safer crosswalk. The proposed project will construct a bulb-out crossing, thus reducing pedestrian exposure to vehicular traffic. Additionally, a HAWK Signal will be utilized to alert vehicular traffic to pedestrian traffic.

The major safety concern is for pedestrian traffic mainly children crossing a busy Highway. Safety measure such as the proposed project will create a safer pathway for pedestrians.

Total Cost Estimate \$280,456.02

Local Share/Match- (20%) \$56,091.20 TA Funds Requested- (80%) \$224,364.82
